Webleos (4th Grade) CORE Adventures that require special planning

1demonstrate how to build a fire; light the fire, unless prohibited
by local fire restrictions. After allowing the flames to burn safely,
safely extinguish the flames with minimal impact to the fire site. Do it
the summer or fall, when weather is good.
2. Prepare a balanced meal for your den or family; utilizing one of the
methods below for preparation of part of your meal: Camp stove,
dutch oven, box oven, solar oven, open campfire or charcoal.

from MEMORY.
6. With your Webelos den or with a family member, hike three miles
(in the country if possible).
7. Complete a service project on or near the hike location.
8. Perform one of the following leadership roles during your hike: trail
leader, first-aid leader, lunch leader, or service project leader.
