Webelos (4th Grade) CORE Adventures that require special planning

Cast Iron Chef	<p>1.demonstrate how to build a fire; light the fire, unless prohibited by local fire restrictions. After allowing the flames to burn safely, safely extinguish the flames with minimal impact to the fire site. Do it the summer or fall, when weather is good.</p> <p>2. Prepare a balanced meal for your den or family; utilizing one of the methods below for preparation of part of your meal: Camp stove, dutch oven, box oven, solar oven, open campfire or charcoal.</p>
Duty to God and You	<p>2.a. Help plan and participate in an interfaith worship service with your den leader. Show reverence during the service. (This is optional – if you choose option 2 you need to complete 3 of the 4 requirements)</p>
First Responder	<p>8. Visit with a first responder.</p>
Stronger, Faster, Higher	<p>5. With adult guidance, lead younger Scouts in a fitness game or games as a gathering activity for a pack or den meeting.</p>
Webelos Walkabout	<p>4. Before a hike, plan and prepare a nutritious lunch. Enjoy it on your hike, and clean up afterward.</p> <p>5. Recite the Outdoor Code and the Leave No Trace Principle for Kids from MEMORY.</p> <p>6. With your Webelos den or with a family member, hike three miles (in the country if possible).</p> <p>7. Complete a service project on or near the hike location.</p> <p>8. Perform one of the following leadership roles during your hike: trail leader, first-aid leader, lunch leader, or service project leader.</p>

Building a Better World	<p>4. Meet with a government leader, and learn about his or her role in your community.</p> <p>6. Camper	<p>1. With the help of your den leader or family, plan and conduct a campout.</p> <p>2. On arrival at the campout determine where to set up your tent. Set up your tent without help from an adult.</p> <p>4. On a PACK campout, work with your den leader to plan a campfire program with other dens. Include an impressive opening, songs, skits, cub master minute, inspirational closing ceremony.</p> <p>6. Go on a geocaching adventure with your den or adult partner. Show how you used a GPS unit or a smartphone with GPS app to locate a geocache.</p> <p>7. Recite the Outdoor Code and Leave No Trace principles for Kids from memory.</p>
Duty to God in Action	<p>2.e. Under the direction of your religious leader, parent or guardian, do an act of service for someone in your family, neighborhood, or religious community. (This is an optional requirement)</p>
Scouting Adventure	<p>1a. Repeat from memory the Scout Oath, Scout Law, Scout motto and scout slogan.</p> <p>1e. Repeat from memory the Outdoor Code. Explain what it means.</p> <p>2. Visit a Boy Scout troop meeting the den members, leaders and parents. After the meeting</p> <p>3. Practice the patrol method for one month....d. As a patrol make plans with a troop to participate in a Boy Scout troop campout or other outdoor activity.</p> <p>4. With your Webelos den leader, parent or guardian, participate in a</p>

	<p>Boy Scout troop's campout or other outdoor activity. Use the patrol method while on the outing. (Yes 3d and 4 is the same - its two different events)</p> <p>6. Demonstrate knowledge of the pocketknife safety. Earn Whittling Chip card if you have not already done so.</p>

Adventures in Science	2. Visit a museum, a college, a laboratory, an observation, a zoo, an aquarium, or other facility that employs scientist. Prepare 3 questions ahead of time and talk to a scientist about his/her work.
Aquanaut	<p>You only need 2x from requirements 7-10...</p> <p>7. Learn and demonstrate two of the following strokes: Crawl, elementary backstroke, sidestroke, breaststroke, trudgen.</p> <p>8. Invite a member or former member of a rescue squad, the US coast Guard, Navy or other armed forces branch who has had swimming and rescue training to your den meeting. Find out what training and other experience this person has had.</p> <p>10. If you are a qualified swimmer, select a paddle of the proper size and paddle a canoe with an adult's supervision. <i>This means in order to earn aquanaut - scouts must pass the BSA swimmer test so they can complete this requirement. Also you need remember the Age appropriate guidelines. As cub scouts - a den scout cannot canoe unless its is flat lake - i.e. with no motor boats and only at council/district event.</i></p>
Art Explosion	<p>1. Visit an art museum, gallery, or exhibit.</p> <p>4. b. Display your artwork in a pack, school, or community art show. (optional)</p>
Aware and Care	7 Do two of the following. <i>Look at this carefully you will need to do a lot of prep work for this.</i>
Build It	5. Learn about a construction career. With your Webelos den leader, parent, or guardian, visit a construction site, and interview someone working in a construction career.
Build My Own Hero	<p>1. Discover what it means to be a hero. Invite a local hero to meet with your den.</p> <p>3. Recognize a hero in your community by presenting him or her with a "My Hero Award".</p> <p>5. Learn about a Scout hero. <i>(Boys Life is a good resource)</i></p>
Castaway	1. Do two of the following: a. With the help of an adult, demonstrate one way to light a fire without using matches. b. On a campout with your den or family, cook two different recipes that do not require pots and pans. c. Using tree limbs or branches that have already fallen or been cut, build a shelter that will protect you overnight.

	<p>2.b. Show you can live “off the grid” by minimizing your use of electricity for one week. Keep a log of what you did.</p> <p>2.e. Teach your game (the den creates in 2.c and 2.d.) to members of the Pack .</p>
Engineer	<p>2.c. Share your project with your Webelos den and your pack by displaying the project at a pack meeting.</p> <p>4. Pick and do two projects using the engineering skills you have learned. Share your projects with your den, and also exhibit them at a pack meeting.</p>
Fix It	<p>4. Select and do 8 of the following. You need adult supervision for each of these. <i>(There is a long list to select from, but choose carefully for a den meeting coverage)</i></p>
Into the Wild	<p>(one of the options) 9.a. Visit a museum of natural history, a nature center, or a zoo with your family, den, or pack. Tell what you saw.</p>
Into the Woods	<p>4. Visit a nature center, nursery, tree farm, or park and speak with someone knowledgeable about trees and plants that are native to your area. Explain how plants and trees are important to our ecosystem and how they improve our environment.</p>
Maestrol	<p>1. Do a or b: a. Visit a live musical performance, b. Visit a facility that uses a sound mixer, and learn how it is used.</p> <p>3. Do two of the following: (the items need to be performed at a den or pack meeting - if your doing this as a den it should be a pack meeting)</p>
